Plastics like cooldrink bottles, soap bottles, bags, old toys, toothbrush

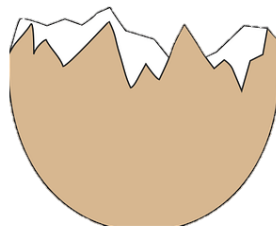
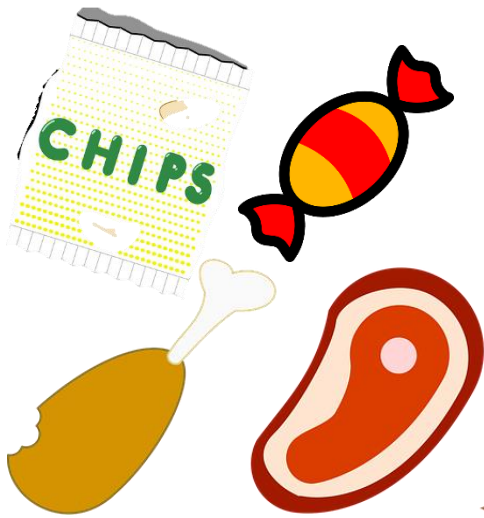
Electronics like old phones, computers, TVs etc.

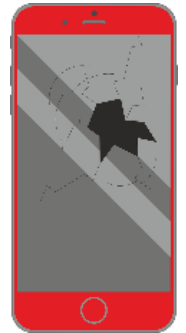
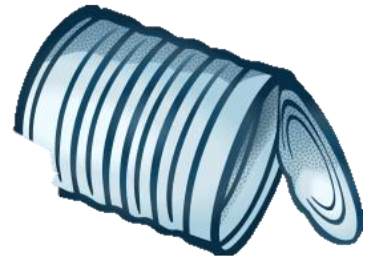
4. Can you help Captain Recycle sort these trash items into the three bins below?
